FAMILY - TENANT - ELDER ISSUES ?

Why not try the University of Windsor - Mediation Services

Mediation usually happens when two or more people are in a dispute that they need help to resolve. Sometimes it is easier to talk about a problem with the help of an independent third party. Mediation is confidential, meaning no one can talk about what happened during mediation after it is over. This also means that what is said in mediation cannot be used against you if you go to court. UWMS (University of Windsor Mediation Services) offers this free local service. Disputes are mediated by the Director and upper-year law students.

Mediators ease communication, helping parties better understand the other party's position and views, even if a solution cannot be reached. Parties are helped to have a constructive, practical discussion about the issues in dispute. The mediator does not create a settlement for the parties or make decisions or give advice about the legal merits of their dispute. Instead, a mediator will assist the parties in having a constructive discussion with one another.



Mediation Services ask that parties commit a minimum of two hours of their time to mediation. Meetings typically take place at the law school, but other arrangements can be made in special circumstances. They mediate many kinds of disputes, including: landlord-tenant, tenant-tenant, elder conflict, employment and adult victim-offender. Most recently, UWMS started mediating Child Support Variation disputes.



Child Support Variance mediation involves disputes about the amount of child support paid by a parent. Many agencies have reported that when people are laid off, go on OntarioWorks or EI, or otherwise experience changes in their income, that they have trouble varying the amounts they pay in child support. This is especially an issue in Windsor-Essex given economic conditions. Mediation Services can help facilitate the discussion between parties and help parties fill out the required paperwork for OntarioWorks, the Family Responsibility Office, and the Family Law Information Centre duty counsel, easing the often confusing legal process. UWMS do not currently provide mediation in the areas of access or spousal support. More information is available on their website at

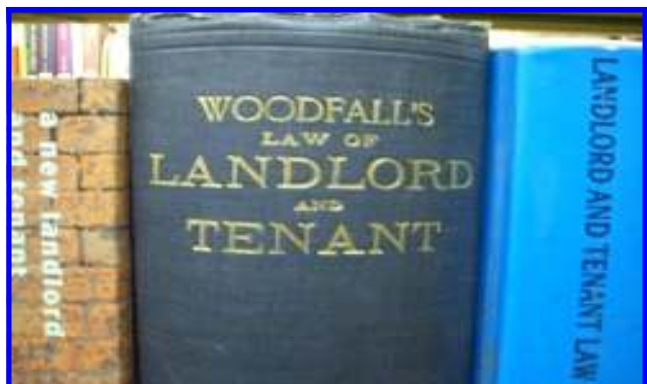

This shutdown could be extended if the US courts hold up the Chrysler Bankruptcy hearings for any length of time.
